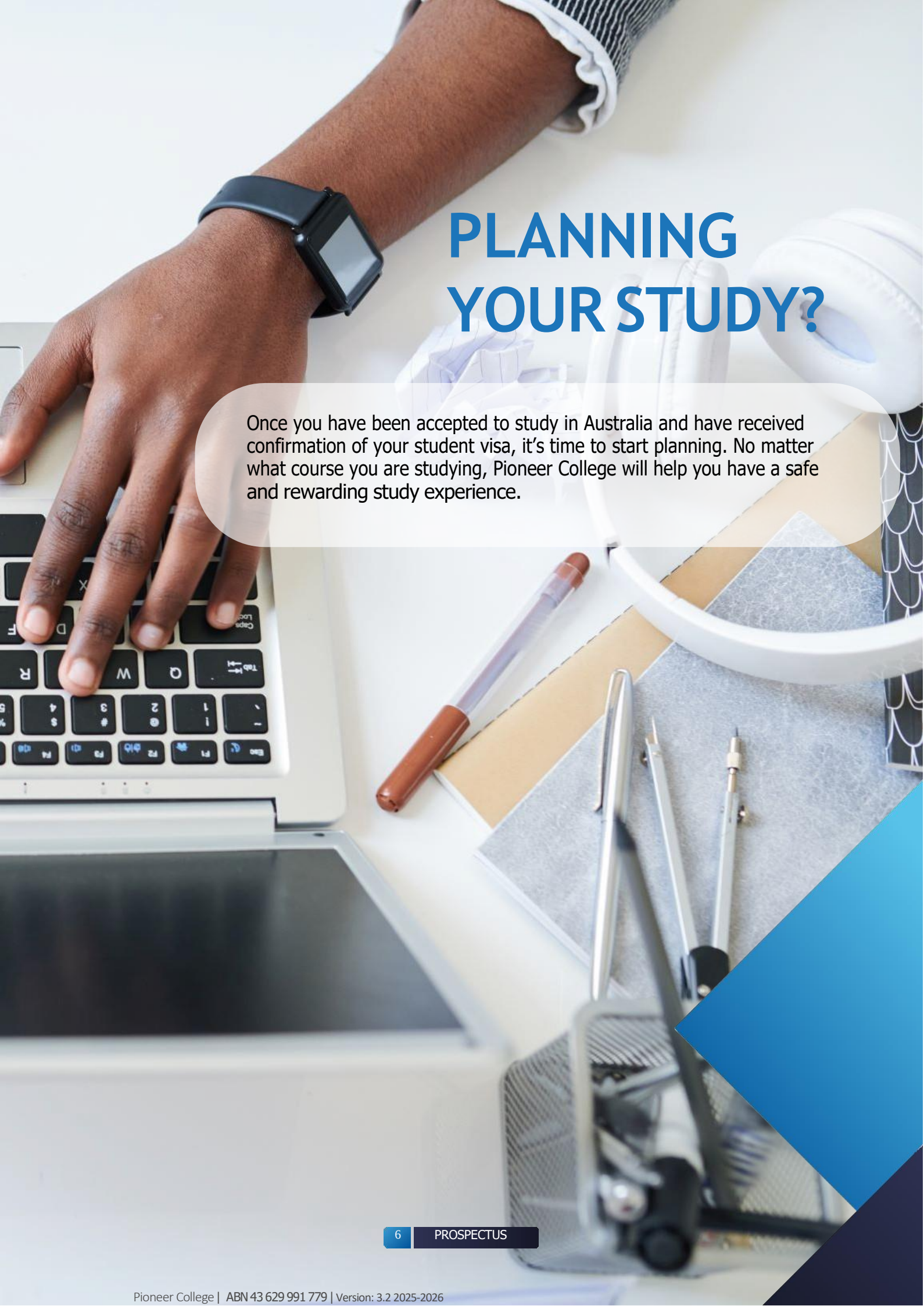

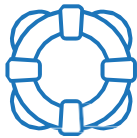
Accommodation

Costs

Knowing the average cost of living and studying in Australia is an important part of your application and financial preparation, plus other living expenses



Health and Safety

Australia is generally a very safe place to live and study, but it is still important to be aware of the risks that exist.



Insurance

While you must have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC), you can also access private health, travel, home and contents, and vehicle insurance in Australia.



Support Services

Work

Working while you study in Australia can help complement your overall experience. You can possibly find employment and work up to 48 hours every two weeks while you are studying, unlimited hours during holiday breaks.



Estimation of costs

Accommodation

- Hostels and Guesthouses - \$90 to \$150 per week
- Shared Rental - \$150 to \$250 per week
- On campus - \$110 to \$280 per week
- Homestay - \$235 to \$325 per week
- Rental - \$185 to \$440 per week
- Boarding schools - \$11,000 to \$22,000 a year

Other living expenses

- Groceries and eating out - \$140 to \$280 per week
- Gas, electricity - \$20 to \$30 per week
- Phone and Internet - \$15 to \$30 per week
- Public transport - \$25 to \$45 per week
- Car (after purchase) - \$200 to \$300 per week
- Entertainment - \$80 to \$150 per week

Cost of Living

The Department of Home Affairs has financial requirements that you must meet in order to receive a student visa for Australia.

As of May 10, 2024, the 12-month living costs are:

- For students or guardians – AUD \$ 29,710
- For partners coming with you – AUD \$ 10,394
- For a child coming with you – AUD \$ 4,449





Visa Compliance

Once you have received your visa, there are requirements you must meet in order for it to remain valid including:

- You must remain enrolled and maintain satisfactory course progress and attendance.
- If you wish to change your qualification level, you may need to apply for a new student visa.
- Provide your Australian address to your institution so they can contact you and let them know if you change address.
- You must continue to be able to support yourself financially while you are in Australia.
- Do not breach the working conditions applicable to your visa.

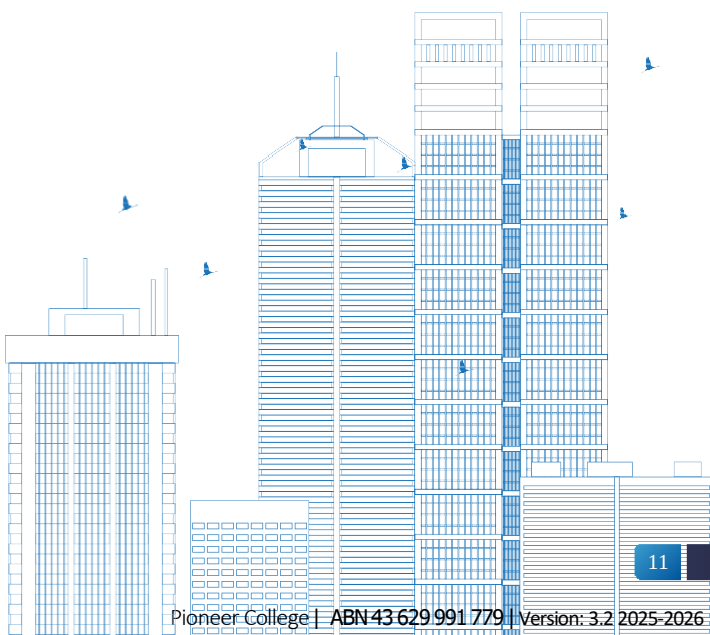

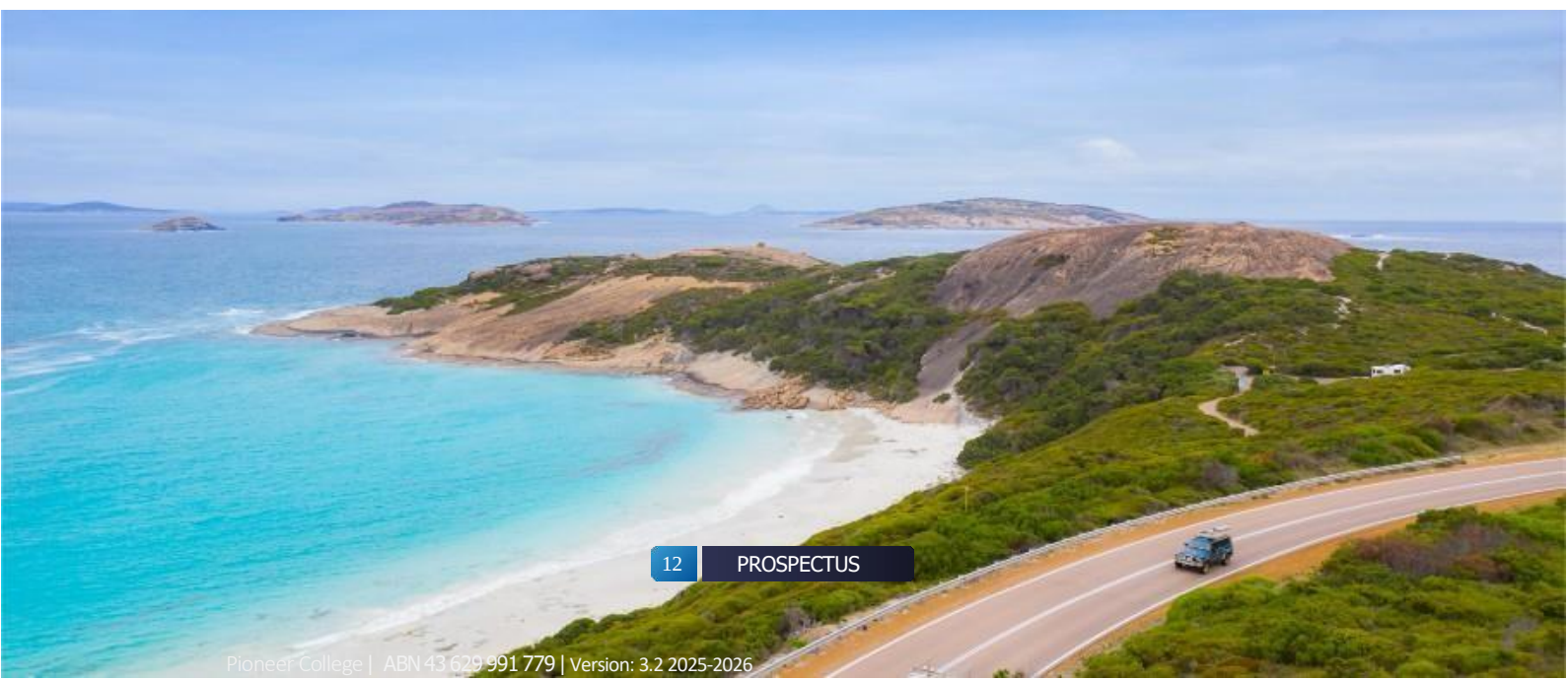
Our vision is to be a world-class vocational education and training organisation that equips international students with advanced and innovative industry skills and knowledge that make a significant contribution to the national and global economy.
